YEAR 10 GCSE OPTIONS DAY Monday 25 February 2019 (9.00 am – 12.00 noon)

This September, our current Year 10 students will begin their GCSE studies. Before doing so they must make some important decisions regarding their choice of GCSE courses; decisions which may have significant effects on their career paths, especially on what they are able to study two years hence at A-level and beyond.

Year 10 students and their parents are invited to take part in the decision-making process and to talk matters over with our teachers during the GCSE Options Day. To help our students make these important decisions the updated **GCSE Options Booklet** will soon be available on the College website (www.knock.co.uk). Please take some time to discuss its contents with your son/daughter. You may also wish to bring your son/daughter's **End of Term 1 Assessments Report** to the Options Day as a basis for discussion.

Our GCSE Options Day is scheduled to begin at **9.00 am sharp** with three short presentations in the College Hall. After the presentations, Subject staff, Careers staff and Tutors will be available in the Sports Hall until 12.00 noon, to discuss your son/daughter's progress in Year 10 and to give guidance on GCSE course choice.

Enclosed with this letter is the programme for the Options Day and a GCSE Options Form. **The Options Form should be completed and returned to the College by Monday 4 March. It may also be returned to the College Reception during the GCSE Options Day.**

Please note that all Year 10 students are expected to attend the Options Day. If your son/daughter is unable to attend I would be grateful if you would indicate this in writing to the Head of Junior School, Mrs Sloan, and include the reason for non-attendance. The College attendance register will be marked accordingly.

YEAR 11 GCSE OPTIONS FORM - 2019/20

- Year 11 students can study 10, 11 or 12 GCSE examination courses.
- All students must study a **core of five GCSE courses**: English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Learning for Life & Work and Religious Studies.
- Year 10 students will sit an internally marked Mathematics exam in late May. The highest ranked students in this examination will be offered the opportunity to fast track through GCSE Mathematics in Year 11 and take GCSE Further Mathematics in Year 12. All other students will study GCSE Mathematics over two years, Year 11 and 12.
- In addition to GCSE examination courses, non-examination Careers Education, Physical Education and the College Personal Development Programme are compulsory for all students.

OPTIONAL GCSE COURSES

1. Choose **five GCSE courses** from Groups 1, 2 and 3 (Science Double Award is equivalent to two courses).
2. It is strongly recommended that you **choose at least one science course from Group 1**. Any combination of the separate sciences can be chosen. If you choose Science Double Award you cannot choose the separate sciences. If you choose Science Double Award you have three choices left from Groups 2 and/or 3.
3. It is strongly recommended that you **choose a modern language from Group 2**. You may choose more than one modern language.
4. **Group 3** contains the other **optional courses**.
5. **Music** may be taken as a **one-year** course during three **lunch periods** in Year 11 **in addition** to your five other course choices. Students must consult with the Head of Music, Mrs McCanny, before selecting this option. Music students can only mark one Music box, either the one-year or the two-year course.
6. You can select either **Digital Technology** or **Computer Science** but not both.
7. Students proposing **not** to study a **science or language** course **must** consult with their subject teachers and Careers staff.
